Ring Out the Old, Ring in The New!

Tomorrow, we will ring in the 2020 New Year in the New Decade. With that in mind, let us remember that famous poem by the very famous Poet Laureate Alfred Lord Tennyson!

"Ring Out, Wild Bells" is a poem by Alfred, Lord Tennyson (please see his portrait in the attached file). Published in 1850, the year he was appointed Poet Laureate, it forms part of *In Memoriam*, Tennyson's elegy to Arthur Henry Hallam, his sister's fiancé who died at the age of twenty-two.

According to a story widely held in Waltham Abbey and repeated on many websites, the 'wild bells' in question were the bells of the Abbey Church. According to the local story, Tennyson was staying at High Beach in the vicinity and heard the bells being rung on New Year's Eve.

It is an accepted English custom to ring English Full circle bells to ring out the old year and ring in the new year over midnight on New Year's Eve. Sometimes the bells are rung half-muffled for the death of the old year, then the muffles are removed to ring without muffling to mark the birth of the new year.

So, let us present the first three verses of this beautiful poem:

Ring out, wild bells, to the wild sky, The flying cloud, the frosty light: The year is dying in the night; Ring out, wild bells, and let him die.

Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow: The year is going, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true.

Ring out the grief that saps the mind, For those that here we see no more; Ring out the feud of rich and poor, Ring in redress to all mankind.

These are some beautiful words to let go the old year and bring in the New Year with hope and good wishes!
